Waters Falls

Alpine and Scouting legend Bill Waters has been honoured by the naming of a waterfall after him. Waters Falls, as they are now officially called, are near Fainters Falls close to Bogong village. They were previously unnamed, due to their remote location in difficult terrain, and were one of two falls revealed in 2005 during site research for a new hydro power station.

The campaign to name the falls after this pioneer of Alpine walking and skiing has been led by one of Bill Water's former friends and a fellow Rover, Jim Crebbin.

It has been a lengthy wait for Jim Creebin, an Alpine Rover, who has been pushing for the naming of the falls for over 6 years. The second waterfall is called Tree Fern Falls. You can see the falls on the final upward drive into Falls Creek on the opposite ridge. Wallace's Hut Restoration

Parks Victoria and the Victorian High Country Huts Association have been doing some great work in restoring Wallace's Hut. The work crews have so far spent two weekends based at the Chalet working to bring the hut back to its original condition. Using traditional building techniques and few modern tools they have excavated the land around the hut to its original level and replaced all of the rotten timbers.

To see the quality of the work being done and the passion of the volunteers doing the work is awe inspiring and the Alpine and Bogong Rover Crews thank them for this.

Maintenance Tasks Completed

- Maintenance tasks that have been completed this year have included:
- Improved fuel supply to Ned (the drying room heater)
- Replaced Dining room fireplace for a slow combustion heater
- About 2 rows of Snowgum wood chopped and stacked in woodshed (supplied to us by Parks Victoria)
- UV treatment reinstalled and operating
- Fireplace bricked up and working very well

- Extra 24V lights installed in dining room
- Brighter Lights in wood shed and bulk pantry
- New First Aid Kit
- Fly screens repaired and new ones installed to toilet windows
- Wardens flat window repaired
- New rope installed on new flagpole
- Bulk food stock-take completed
- Axes and splitters re-handled
- Grease trap didn't need cleaning the 'bugs' work!

We still have quite a few items on the list to be completed before Winter. It would be great if you could help us at the Easter Working Bee.

Local Fauna

We thought they were out there but have a look at this little beauty we nearly ran a wheel burrow over on the Labour Day Working bee. Please be careful in the Australian Bush.

Remember- First Aid for a Snake Bite:

- 1. Check for danger to yourself!
- 2. Calm and reassure patient
- 3. Bandage firmly over the bite, then up the limb towards the heart,
- then down the limb away from the heart.



First Aid Kits

The chalet has some expedition and workplace first aid kits. These have been raided over winter and would not have been useful if we had a medical emergency over summer. The first aid kits at the chalet are for medical emergencies. We remind all chalet users that they should plan to be self sufficient in regards to personal first aid kits and medical/blister treatment supplies. A stock of medical supplies is available in the first aid cupboard to deal with minor injuries.
